Acceptance of AA and/or AS degree

A minimum of 60 semester hours of accepted transfer credit.

Acceptance of Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses

EIU accepts college-level courses from any regionally accredited college or university as college credit. Remedial, developmental or orientational courses are NOT accepted. Hours and courses transfer as credit towards graduation; however, all requirements for a major must be met.

Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

EIU is a full participant. The IAI GECC may be completed after transfer if 30 or more hours of transfer credit have been earned. The IAI GECC may include non-IAI approved courses.

EIU requires a cultural diversity course, which can be satisfied by completing the IAI GECC, or a baccalaureate-oriented associates degree, to taking any IAI designated "D" or "N" course
